We are pleased to announce an important update to our Internship program. We now offer Australian graduates the opportunity to preference Greenslopes Private Hospital (GPH) for your Internship program. Greenslopes Private Hospital is now a part of the Intern ballot and you have the choice of occupying one of the 12 GPH Intern positions available in the ballot.

Intern Training Program

The program has been developed over a number of years with a focus of offering interns exposure during their training to:

- The private and public healthcare system
- And the metropolitan and regional/rural settings

GPH has developed strong working relationships with the multiple specialty crafts across the hospital and several regional/rural sites which provide:

- A welcoming environment and comprehensive orientation
- Broad casemix with great learning opportunities
- Strong education and teaching from our Medical Education Unit
- Support from GPH whilst rotations offsite.
- Dynamic supervision, ward based teaching and support from SMOs/Consultants

As a part of the program you will be given the option of completing one external regional/rural rotations. Some of our regular sites are Alice Springs, Thursday Island, Bamaga, Weipa, Cooktown and Kingaroy. Accommodation and transport will be coordinated for you when on a regional/rural rotation.

Leave is planned in conjunction with allocation requests and is planned as a 5 week block ensuring continuity of learning opportunities.

GPH will encourage you to become actively involved with learning opportunities onsite or within the network, including presentations, mock exams preparation, committees, audits and research.

GPH Term allocations

- Opportunity to complete a Survey Monkey to list your preferences for term and leave allocation
- Total of 5 Terms with one term split into 5 weeks of blocked leave matched with your 5 weeks of service/relief term – Duty Medical Officers (DMO) shifts.

GPH weekly education sessions:

- Division of Medicine Meeting – Mondays
- Intern Education – Wednesday
- Medical Ground Rounds – Thursdays
- JMO Education – Friday

Additional education sessions:

- High-fidelity SIMULATION sessions delivered by the Simulation Centre team. This includes Patient deterioration SIMULATION; Clinical/Procedural Skills; ALS/BLS/ANNT/Patient Manual Handling
- Unit Meetings / Journal Club
- Completion of Rural Readiness course prior to Rural rotation

Whilst offsite you will receive site specific education. Some locations will also teleconference into GPH teaching.

Bamaga & Thursday Island – Queensland, Australia

Sprawling from the northernmost tip of the Australian mainland to just 4km south of Papua New Guinea, the Torres Strait Islands and the Northern Peninsula Area form an awe-inspiring backdrop for adventure and unique medicine. The azul waters of the Torres Strait surrounds reefringed tropical islands brimming with coconut palms and warm sand.



History

About the land

The Royal Navy had surveyed much of the Northern Peninsula by 1850, and noted many locals who were experienced in reef fishing and coastal farming, as well as pearl and shell trading.

Traditional Custodians

- Thursday Island – Kaurareg peoples
- Bamaga – Anggamuthi, Atambaya, Wuthathi, Yadhaykenu and Gudang peoples

Tourism

The Torres Strait and Northern Peninsula Area boast world-class fishing with a healthy supply of Spanish mackerel, longtail tuna, coral trout, nannygai, red emperor, mud crabs

and tropical rock lobster. Excellent spots for camping, hiking, mountain biking, kayaking, and trail running are plentiful throughout the region.

Health Services

Medical Officers working in the Torres Strait are based on Thursday Island and provide acute care, primary care, and outreach services to the 17 primary health care centres dotted across the region. Thursday Island has an operating theatre, maternity unit, inpatient ward, dialysis unit and emergency department. Bamaga is the 'hub site' site the Northern Peninsula Area and has a hospital and primary health care centre. Medical Officers work across both sites, as well as providing outreach to three small primary health care centres based around the area.

Kingaroy – Queensland, Australia

Kingaroy is a rural town in the South Burnett Region, about 218 kilometres northwest of Brisbane. Known as the "Peanut Capital of Australia", Kingaroy is surrounded by beautiful rolling hills and extensive farmlands.



History

Kingaroy derives its name from the Wakka Wakka aboriginal word 'Red Ant' (Kingaroori) because of the unique species of ant found in the area. European settlement dates back to 1843, with many pioneers attracted to the area for its rich volcanic soils and farming opportunities.

Alice Springs – Northern Territory, Australia
