

Prevocational trainee transfer guide

Purpose

This guide applies to current Queensland Rural Generalist Pathway (QRGP) trainee interns requesting to transfer hospitals for their Junior House Officer (JHO) year.

As a general rule, we do not encourage transfer during prevocational training. A trainee submitting a transfer intention does not place any liability or onus on the QRGP team to ensure the transfer occurs.

Process

- 1. You must advise the QRGP team in writing of your intention to transfer to another <u>Rural generalist</u> <u>prevocational training hospital</u>, including the reason/s for the transfer. Correspondence should be emailed to <u>rural_generalist@health.qld.gov.au</u>.
- 2. The transfer intention will be discussed at a QRGP team meeting and you will be provided with further advice.
- 3. We recommend you confirm the following arrangements with the prospective hospital you wish to transfer to prior to formalising your transfer:
 - position options
 - access to your remaining prevocational training terms a minimum of 5 weeks (preferably 10 weeks) in emergency medicine, paediatrics, anaesthetics and obstetrics and gynaecology is required by the end of postgraduate year 2 (PGY2)
 - release to attend an allocated Rural generalist trainee workshop in PGY2 (If not, you will be required to access leave to attend).
- 4. You must formally notify your current hospital of your intention to transfer, subject to the outcome of the RMO Campaign.
- 5. You must apply for a position at the prospective hospital via the <u>RMO Campaign</u> (applications usually open in June of the year prior).
- 6. You must advise the QRGP team and your current hospital of the RMO application outcome.
