

Interview exemption process

If you have already commenced training and need further placements to meet outstanding Royal Australasian College of Physicians (RACP) requirements (other than passing the exams), and you plan to undertake these in Queensland, you must first be selected onto the Queensland Basic Paediatric Training Network.

If you're applying to join the network, in some cases you may be exempt from sitting a network selection interview.

Eligibility and application

To be deemed eligible you must:

- meet Queensland Basic Paediatric Training [network eligibility criteria](#)
- have commenced RACP basic training in Paediatrics and Child Health
- have been working as a registrar (or equivalent level) for 6 months or more
- have not been on an interruption to training for a period greater than 12 months immediately prior to the anticipated start date with the network
- have not been working outside of an accredited setting during the preceding 12-month period
- have satisfactory referee reports in your RMO Campaign application
- be formally supported by your current Director of Paediatric Education (DPE) for continuation of training. This formal support will be requested in your RMO application
- **New curriculum trainees:** demonstrate progression without significant conditions on your most recent Progress Review Panel (PRP) assessment
 - Minor conditions (e.g., outstanding WBAs or diversity of training) may be accepted at network medical director discretion
 - If PRP outcomes are not yet finalised, rotation/mid-phase reports may be provided instead
- be willing to accept available training positions within the rotation
- provide a summary of certified terms and terms awaiting certification to assess remaining time-based requirements.

The network medical director will consider your application based on merit, training capacity within the rotation, and the availability of suitable allocations. The network will advise you if there is insufficient capacity, in which case you may need to consider other network rotations.

If all criteria can be met, you may be offered and allocated a network training place without a network interview (MMI).

Cases where an interview may be required

- demand for positions exceeds available positions
- allocation requires ranking to ensure fairness
- vacant training capacity could alternatively be used for new trainees (BPT1s)
- other aspects requiring equitably ranking to allocate (e.g. limited job-share capacity for part-time requests).

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
