- Liaison service to Acute Stroke Unit (RBWH)
- Orthogeriatric Service located in orthopaedic ward (RBWH)
- Residential Aged Care District Assessment and Referral (RADAR) Service
 - AT positions shared 2nd yearly with Department of Emergency Medicine(RBWH)
- Specialist clinics (Memory disorder, Geriatric Assessment (Incl Falls), Rehabilitation Assessment, Spasticity Management Clinic) – Day hospital premises at STARS
