Endocrinology advanced trainee preference guide

Endocrinology training positions throughout Queensland and the Northern Territory are allocated to trainees by a combined selection panel with representatives from each hospital. Trainees are selected on the basis of curriculum vitae score, referee reports and performance at a brief structured interview. Trainees will generally be allocated to a non-metropolitan hospital for their first year of training and then will be allocated a second year of training based on trainee preference, merit ranking and training needs. There is also an option for a third year of clinical training at selected sites if this is requested by trainees.

This training programme supports part-time training options and will facilitate this wherever possible.

Please note that it is not recommended that trainees contact directors individually regarding endocrine training prior to the interview process.

2 x full-time RCY AT positions

0.5 FTE Core AT position (shared with Chief Medical Registrar position – best suited for a third year trainee)

7 consultants/ 4.3 FTE + 1 Public Health physician

Other junior doctor FTE (ie. residents / BPTs):

On-call and weekend cover requirements:

ATS are always first on call on weekdays. Consultant second on call. Our trainees are paid for taking the on call Weekend shared between 2 ATs, Obs Med AT (supported by endocrine), resident and BPT: 1 in 5

On-call and weekend cover requirements:

Our two trainees share first on-call duties during ordinary weekday hours to respond to requests for inpatient consultation and admissions. No after hours on call, 1 in 3-4 weekends (Sat and Sun ward round), with Consultant Supervision

Housed in a brand-new facility, currently funded for 4 inpatient beds which will increase to 12 in Q2 2024

Other junior doctor FTE (ie. residents / BPTs):

Share resident (usually BPT) with infectious diseases

After-hours commitments:

1 in 2 Sat ward rounds – no on call for Endocrine.
Weekend round will include endo inpatients/consults.
Inclusion in Gen Med remote on call roster.
Generally able to access one afternoon off per week.

Specialty clinics:

Young Adult Diabetes, Young Adult Endocrine, Turners Clinic, Cystic Fibrosis, After Cancer Care, General Endocrine (including pituitary), Diabetes, Metabolic/Inborn errors, Obstetric Medicine, High risk foot clinic

Core position has metabolic exposure and Outreach clinics – Inala, Mt Isa and weekly Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Clinic (ATSIC)
Endocrine dynamic testing exposure

Exposure to multidisciplinary specialty team meetings: Pituitary MDT (1-2 monthly in house and can dial in to PAH meeting), Endocrine Surgical MDT (monthly), Chem Path combined teaching meeting 2-3 monthly

Inpatient beds / inpatient clinical exposure:

Mater Hospital in South Brisbane offers a broad diabetes and endocrine exposure. We have a strong emphasis on type 1 diabetes and technology and care for a number of young adults, with dedicated multi-disciplinary clinics for their care. We usually have 1-4 inpatients under the direct care of endocrinology. Inpatient exposure is mostly consultation on diabetes / endocrine issues for patients admitted under other specialty teams.

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Number and type of advanced trainee positions:

2 full-time RCY positions – due to distance between the outpatient clinic and main hospital, the two full-time registrars rotate every 2 months between the “Clinic registrar” and “Ward registrar” roles

1 part-time (0.5 FTE) RCY position – 3 clinics and 2 ward sessions over 2.5 days

Number of Consultants / Consultant FTE:

14 consultants (5.4 total FTE)

Other junior doctor FTE (ie. residents / BPTs):

1 BPT registrar

1.5 Residents (1 x house officer, Intern for some rotations)

On-call and weekend cover requirements:

Endocrinology weekend ward rounds 1 in 5 weekends

Remote Endocrinology on-call 1 in 4 weeks (weeknights) for inpatients (not ED / ICU)

There is a rostered half-day every week (either Thursday or Friday)

Specialty Clinics:

Weekly clinics in the areas of: Diabetes (including an after-hours T1DM clinic, Pump Clinic, Diabetes-Renal Clinic), Bone / Menopause / Female Reproductive Endocrine Clinic, General Endocrinology (including pituitary and adrenal disease), Rapid Access Thyroid Clinic, Complex Obesity Clinic, Diabetes / Endocrine Telehealth Clinics (to regional / remote locations) and Secure Unit Clinic. There are also monthly Combined Endocrine Genetics Clinics and bimonthly Prader Willi Clinics.

Exposure to multidisciplinary specialty team meetings: Pituitary MDT (monthly), Endocrine Surgical MDT (monthly), Adrenal MDT (bi-monthly), Metabolic Surgery MDT (monthly), Endocrine Genetics MDT (monthly)

The advanced trainees are also regularly involved with Endocrine Dynamic Testing along with the Endocrine Nursing service.

Inpatient beds / inpatient clinical exposure:

Princess Alexandra Hospital has ~1000 beds and is a tertiary teaching hospital with broad clinical exposure (inc. renal and liver transplant, but not heart / lung / pancreas transplant).

We usually have 1-4 inpatients under the direct care of endocrinology. Inpatient exposure is mostly consultation on diabetes / endocrine issues for patients admitted under other specialty teams.

Number and type of advanced trainee positions:

3 positions available via QLD match (2 RCY + 1 Core)

(+0.5 FTE Endocrine Research Fellow position, most commonly for immediately post FRACP; not offered every year – appointed maximum to 2 years)

Number of Consultants / Consultant FTE:

14 consultants (4.8 FTE)

Other junior doctor FTE (ie. residents / BPTs):

1 Senior House Officer

On-call and weekend cover requirements:

No weekend Endocrinology ward rounds



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No remote Endocrinology on-call
Hospital rostered medical registrar shifts, some evenings/weekends
(ward consults during daytime hours below)

Specialty Clinics:

In addition to diabetes and obstetric endocrinology clinics, the Department offers exposure to weekly tertiary-referral clinics of: bone (including complex metabolic bone disease), endocrinology (including pituitary and adrenal disease), endocrine oncology (managing patients with genetic tumour syndromes, patients with neuroendocrine tumours including those receiving Lutate therapy, and endocrine complications of cancer), lipids, thyroid, thyroid cancer (multidisciplinary with radiation oncology; includes 3-monthly medullary thyroid cancer clinic), and women's health clinics (multidisciplinary with gynaecology). Trainees will rotate through all subspecialties in 4-month rotations (2x clinic only, 1x ward consults with small clinic load).

Exposure to multidisciplinary specialty team meetings: neuroendocrine tumours (weekly; 4-months), thyroid cancer (weekly; 4-months), pituitary (monthly + monthly joint clinic with neurosurgery; full year), and endocrine surgery (monthly; full year).

Inpatient beds / inpatient clinical exposure:

The RBWH has approximately 900 beds and covers every specialty of adult medicine and surgery except cardiac surgery. The direct inpatient load for the Department is light; most inpatient care of diabetes is performed by general medical teams. Inpatient exposure is via consulting on endocrine problems across the hospital campus.

Other information:

The Department has a busy clinical trials unit with an expanding portfolio of diabetes and endocrine clinical trials. Departmental members' research interests include endocrine epidemiology, thyroid disease, thyroid cancer, bone and mineral metabolism, digital health, women's health, and inpatient diabetes. The Department also is linked to a basic science laboratory assessing placental metabolism (particularly thyroid hormone metabolism).

Number and type of advanced trainee positions:

Two RCY positions from the QLD match

We have a 'clinics registrar' and a 'ward' registrar and they rotate these roles 3 monthly.

Number of Consultants / Consultant FTE:

5 consultants: 1 consultant on 0.9FTE and 4 on 0.4FTE

Other junior doctor FTE (ie. residents / BPTs):

Nil – endocrinology does not have an inpatient bed card and hence does not have junior doctor support.

On-call and weekend cover requirements:

The 2 registrars alternate weekly on-call and weekend cover, with consultants first on call once/month for the weekends. As there is no endocrine inpatient unit, the burden of on-call is minimal and the expectation for the weekends is either not to attend face to face or to come in briefly on one day. Consultants are supportive of both registrars attending conferences and will be 1st on call during these periods.

Specialty Clinics:

General endocrinology, Obstetric endocrinology, Diabetes clinics (including JDR (joint diabetes clinic), transition clinic, Danila Dilba (ACCHO) outreach, pump clinic, diabetic foot clinic), Weight Management Clinic, Men's Health clinic, transgender clinic, Telehealth clinic and regular outreach/ clinics (to remote communities).



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Inpatient beds / inpatient clinical exposure:

360 beds. As Royal Darwin Hospital is the only tertiary hospital in the region, it is the first point of contact for all patients and hence there is a broad range of exposures to diverse clinical conditions. What is unique to the Territory is the large proportion of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and hence there is exposure to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health care. Compared to non-Indigenous Australians, Aboriginal people disproportionately experience type 2 diabetes and its complications at a young age as well as type 2 diabetes in pregnancy. As the majority of Aboriginal people in the NT live in remote communities, there is the opportunity for regular endocrine outreach to these communities.

Potential third year positions:

The endocrine department is strongly linked with Menzies School of Health Research and for people interested in a PhD focused on remote health/diabetes/diabetes in pregnancy then there are options for third year roles that involve commencing a PhD within Menzies School of Health research combined with a potential clinical role at RDH.

Weekend WR (shared with ID team) ~ once every 2 months to review inpatients only. SMO on call otherwise.

Endocrine: General endocrine – adrenal, thyroid, disorders of calcium, pituitary. Metabolic Bone Disease, Combined Endocrine Surgery clinic. Diabetes: T2DM, T1DM (inc CSII), Young adult clinic/transition, Diabetes in Pregnancy/Gestational Diabetes. High Risk Foot Service: Podiatry/ID/Vascular.

Outreach Clinics: Nambour (SMO only at this stage), Gympie

Approx. 4 weekend admitting shifts (2 x 12 hour) per year, plus 3-4 evening admitting shifts per year

3 x general endocrine clinics, 2 x diabetes clinics, 1 x obstetric medicine clinic

Specialty MDTs:

MDT Thyroid / Parathyroid (monthly)

Inpatient beds / inpatient clinical exposure:

No endocrine inpatients

New diabetes/endocrine ward consults 2-5 per day, plus obstetric medicine consults 1-2 per week.

External calls from GP's/rural hospitals also covered.

Number and type of advanced trainee positions:

2 RCY full-time positions

We have 2 registrars recruited through the Statewide recruitment process QLD/NT pathway every year for RCY positions. There is an Obstetric Medicine AT position through the General Medicine Statewide selection process which is held separately.

Number of Consultants / Consultant FTE:

We have 2 consultant (1 FTE) 1 consultant (0.9FTE) 2 consultants (0.2 FTE) one consultant (0.3 FTE) and a VMO (0.1FTE)

Other junior doctor FTE (ie. residents / BPTs):

We have 1 RMO, 1 Intern and BPT (Endo/Rheu -3.5 days in Endo/1.5 days in Rheumatology)

On-call and weekend cover requirements:

No on-call but is planned for the future for the week when weekend on call

Weekend cover 1 in 10 currently shared with Renal and Rheumatology trainees. Opportunity to do extra weekends in internal medicine as a financial incentive (need to volunteer weekends)

Lot of opportunities to discover North-Queensland (Magnetic Island, Cairns, Tablelands, Whitsundays) and have a good work/life balance.

Specialty Clinics:

General Endocrinology, High risk antenatal (obstetric medicine) clinic, Transition clinic, TAIHS and Kirwan community clinic, Diabetes clinic, High Risk Foot clinic, Weight management clinic and Telehealth

Outreach clinic to Palm Island, Sexual health and Transgender clinic, Indigenous health clinic, there is planning to start Thyroid and Bone clinic (including BMD) separately. There is opportunity to work with the paediatric endocrinologist in a joint transition clinic.

Inpatient beds / inpatient clinical exposure:

785 bed hospital –major tertiary hospital in North Queensland and provides broad clinical experience in management of diabetes, thyroid, bone, parathyroid, adrenal, pituitary disease patients including pituitary and endocrine surgery and nuclear medicine. Renal transplantation is also due to start in 2024/2025.

Potential third year positions:

There is an opportunity to do PhD in vascular medicine or diabetic feet at JCU.

Third year AT can join to consolidate their clinical experience and can also get 6 months obstetric medicine experience and certificate.
