Service benefits (drawcard)	Hervey Bay is a subtropical town located across from K'gari Island, which is listed as a World Heritage Site. It is a jumping-off point for Lady Elliot Island and the Barrier Reef. The Hervey Bay Hospital is a modern service of 240 beds. The General Medical department has 64 beds with a planned new build intended to increase these to 84 beds by the end of 2024. There are also 10 renal chairs, 14 oncology chairs and six ICU ventilator beds. Geriatric Medicine has both a community and inpatient service. Advanced Trainees in General Medicine would not be rostered to nights as they are needed in daylight hours to lead and direct junior staff. An Advanced Trainee in their final year of training could be appointed as the "Chief Registrar" and would be offered opportunities to act as a junior consultant. Interested Advanced Trainees could spend 6 months in the general medical or a related service. There is also the opportunity to choose a subspecialty rotation in ICU, Oncology, Geriatrics or Renal Medicine. Appointment to Hervey Bay Hospital is a fantastic opportunity for a Trainee who wants to experience a different lifestyle in a hospital that has great training opportunities and has the reputation of being a happy place to work.
