PROGRAM

The Logan Geriatrics and Rehabilitation Service is a service in the Metro South Health District. It comprises a 24 bed inpatient rehabilitation unit, 8-12 ReACH – day hospital beds, Acute Geriatric Medicine service, GEMITH service, Orthogeriatric/Peri-operative service, Geriatric consultation-liaison service, Geriatrics and Emergency Department Interface (GEDI) service, Inpatient GEM unit, complex care unit and a geriatric and rehabilitation outpatient clinic service. Outreach services are provided to Logan TCP, and the Community Ambulatory Rehabilitation Services. It is closely allied with the Metro south Geriatric and Rehabilitation service and Gold Coast rehabilitation service. It is also linked with the Griffith University Medical School and the University of Queensland.

Number/type of Geriatric Beds:

24 General Rehabilitation and Geriatrics beds, 12 day hospital rehab beds, 10-12 GEMITH beds 32 acute geriatric medicine Beds (2 teams), A mixed complex discharge + GEM inpatient unit (24-28 beds)

Consult Services:

Geriatric consultation liaison service 5 days a week.
Orthogeriatric Consultative services for all NOFs and orthopaedic patients over 75 years.
Stroke Liaison Service 5 days a week.
Geriatrics and Emergency Department Interface (GEDI) service

Domiciliary Assessment:

Domiciliary assessments are mainly performed by the GEMITH Service.

Outpatient Clinics/Day Hospital:

Geriatric outpatient clinics (including 2 clinics/ week for the Geriatric Rehabilitation service, 1 clinic a week for GEMITH service and I clinic every fortnight for the Acute care of the elderly service, One clinic for the GEM service) Rehabilitation outpatient clinics fortnightly. Orthogeriatrics and peri-operative clinics weekly. No Day Hospital on site.

Rehabilitation is provided by the ReACH service, a novel day-hospital rehabilitation program delivered in the community, follow up provided by weekly review/case conference by the inpatient rehabilitation service.

GEDI hot clinics twice weekly A multi-disciplinary diagnostic and post diagnostic support Cognitive clinic is due to commence in April/ May 2025.

	Ward responsibilities/workload: Two registrars are responsible for the 24 bed geriatric/rehabilitation ward and the rehabilitation consultation liaison service.
	One registrar is responsible for the orthogeriatric/peri-operative consults for over 75 years
	One registrar is responsible for the GEDI service.
	Two registrars (One AT one BPT) are responsible for the acute geriatric medicine service (32 beds)
	One registrar is responsible for the 10-12 bed GEMITH service.
	One registrar covers the GEM service (14 beds)
	The geriatric medicine liaison service is covered by all the registrars – rostered days.

Consultations: Consults are assessed by registrars, followed by formal consultant rounds 5 days a week.	Specialist Clinic coverage: Apart from the geriatric medicine and rehabilitation medicine clinics mentioned, there are opportunities for domiciliary assessments.
Domiciliary assessments: Most domiciliary visits are conducted via the GEDI program and GEMITH program	Research/presentations: Consultants have experience in supporting and assisting study design and statistical methods for research projects. Advance trainees have presented in international forums. Links with Griffith University and PAH for statistical support
Teaching responsibilities: Year 3 medical students from Griffith University rotate every 3 weeks into the aged care block. Logan Hospital is a training site for basic trainees attempting the FRACP written and practical exams and was an examination site for the FRACP exams.	Rotations available and opportunities for flexible training: Opportunities exist for rotations in general medicine and subspecialties – Chief Medical Registrar, MEU (Medical Education Unit), MAPU, General Medicine/ASU, Infectious Diseases, Renal, Cardiology, Respiratory Medicine, Palliative care.
