PROGRAM:

QEII is a rapidly growing 245 bed District hospital in the southern suburbs of Brisbane. The Geriatrics and Rehabilitation Service provides Comprehensive Geriatric Assessment and Rehabilitation for patients throughout the hospital with a strong emphasis on continuity of care. The acute stroke unit is embedded in the Geriatrics service. There are four positions accredited for core training in Geriatric Medicine. Six months in these positions is preferred.

Acute Geriatrics/Consultation Liaison/BeST

Acute Geriatric unit inpatients 12 beds

Geriatric Medicine consultation liaison

Geriatric Medicine support to the BeST team (multidisciplinary **Be**haviour **S**upport **T**eam for patients with high-risk behaviour requiring advice or development of a behaviour support plan).

Stroke/Orthogeriatrics,

Acute stroke unit 5-12 inpatients

Code Stroke presentations to ED weekdays

Orthogeriatrics consultation service 6-10 patients

Canossa/subacute

24 beds, predominately Geriatric Rehabilitation

Geriatrics OPD at QEII weekly

HITH/GEMR HITH.

8 + 8 beds. Registrar covers both acute HITH and GEMR HITH.

Two Registrars share the roster to provide 7 day a week service, 0800 to 1800.

Weekends are 1:2 (days off during the week) Includes weekend General Medical admissions. **Number/type of Geriatric Beds:** Specialty Clinics: Stroke/OG 5 to 12 inpatients Geriatric Outpatients weekly. DTU provides multidisciplinary rehabilitation for outpatients, particularly recent stroke patients, referred from QEII GARS or other services. Supervision for advanced trainee projects is available.

Quality Assurance:

QEII GARS Safety and Quality meetings every two months QEII Medicine M&M monthly

Trainee Responsibilities

Coverage Roster:

QEII based Reg and RMO share Sat and Sun 0800 to 1200md, 1:5. Occasional participation in QEII Acute General Medicine After Hours roster may be required.

Canossa Reg and RMO share Sat am 0800 to 1200md 1:2.

Ward responsibilities/workload:

Depends on role.

Consultations:

The GARS Registrar is responsible for 6-8 orthogeriatric patients and 6-8 complex consultation liaison patients.

Specialist Clinic coverage:

The GARS Registrar attends Geriatric/DTU outpatients weekly.

Domiciliary assessments / ACAT assessments:

Available through HITH/GEMR HITH rotation

Research/presentations:

Presentation of a Geriatrics or stroke topic at medical teaching sessions every 5 to 6 weeks Presentation of cases at Medicine M&M meetings quarterly.

Teaching responsibilities:

Medical Students usually 3rd year and occasionally 4th year elective students Participation in teaching of nursing and allied health staff.

Participation in medical teaching sessions as above.

Rotations available and opportunities for flexible training:

Appointments at QEII are for 12 months however six month rotations can be negotiated when there is another trainee available to share. Rotations through other Specialties can be considered: QEII has accredited positions in General Medicine, Palliative Care and Intensive care. Rotations through other Geriatric sites could also be considered.
