With three trainees we will be instituting a weekend roster with the trainee doing two half days over the weekend with a day off during the week. This will occur every three weeks. If a trainee is away we will revert to no cover for the weekend the trainee is away so the one in three is preserved. There will be consultant cover by phone or telehealth on those weekends.</p>

This is a unique opportunity to get experience in palliative care in Residential Aged Care.
