

The Prince Charles Hospital

The Prince Charles Hospital is a 700-bed major tertiary referral hospital located at Chermside within Metro North Hospital and Health Service, 10 kilometres north of the Brisbane CBD.

With a long-standing reputation of delivering excellence in health care, The Prince Charles Hospital provides care over a broad range of specialties including: Cardiac and thoracic medicine and surgery, Emergency medicine - adults and children with over 115,000 annual attendances, General medical and general surgical services, Orthopaedic joint surgery (elective) as well as the largest Neck of Femur service in Oueensland. Acute geriatrics and rehabilitative medicine, Children's inpatient and outpatient services Comprehensive and integrated mental health service as well Palliative care.

The Prince Charles Hospital is the premier cardiac service for Queensland and northern New South Wales providing specialised services in complex interventional cardiology, structural heart disease, and cardiac electrophysiology. The hospital employs about 3,500 staff.

It is the hub for specialised state-wide services including heart and lung transplantation; adult cystic fibrosis; adult congenital heart disease; advanced heart failure; percutaneous valve therapies and complex cardiac care.

The Queensland Indigenous Cardiac and Respiratory Outreach Programs are based at The Prince Charles Hospital.

The Prince Charles Hospital is an active centre for education and research and is involved in numerous national and international research trials and projects.

The Northside Clinical Unit campus of The University of Queensland is located on this campus along with the Queensland University of Technology Mechanical and Biological Engineering Facility.

The Australian Catholic University has established a Professorial Chair in Nursing Research on this site.

There are leading clinical and translational research programs, particularly in the fields of cardiac thoracic medicine and surgery, critical care, and orthopaedics.

The site is a major training site for cardiothoracic subspecialties.






