After-Hours Care Unit

The After-Hours Care Unit (AHCU) provides continuing and emergent clinical care to the 707 inpatient beds of the Princess Alexandra Hospital (PAH) out-of-hours. It comprises a leadership, governance and support staff (AHCU Director, AHCU Medical Education registrar, AHCU Coordinator), and the clinical delivery staff (14 rotational RMOs, 10 rotational BPT registrars).

AHCU Medical Education Registrar

The purpose of the AHCU Medical Education Registrar is to support development and delivery of a highquality education program and provide support and supervision to junior medical staff (interns, residents, and medical registrars) rotating through a term in AHCU, while also being actively involved in the operations of the unit and participating in quality improvement and research activities within the unit.


The role is 0.5 FTE for 12 months and suitable for registrars of all specialities for non-core or additional training. The medical education registrar works in-hours and has no clinical responsibilities, the roster is flexible based on AHCU and the registrar's requirements.
