

Medical experience for application to the network

Experience in **general medicine OR medical specialties** (as outlined below) as well as time spent working in Queensland rural and regional hospitals, will contribute towards suitability ranking for selection to the network. Suitability ranking is also one of the key principles used to determine training allocations. The higher your suitability ranking, the more likely it is that you will be allocated your preferred training placements.
