ADVANCED TRAINING IN CARDIOLOGY

THE PRINCE CHARLES HOSPITAL

Advanced Training in Cardiology at The Prince Charles Hospital (TPCH) will be managed directly by the TPCH medical recruitment team. This process is supported by the Cardiology Director at TPCH with advanced training accredited positions.

- The Cardiology Registrar is an advanced trainee of the Royal Australasian College of Physicians. The Registrar provides inpatient and outpatient medical services within the Department of Cardiology and a consultative service to other departments. It is intended that the Registrar will maximise his or her professional development, with a view to completing specialist training according to the guidelines of the RACP and the CSANZ and expected that the Registrar will be involved in the professional development of junior medical staff.
- The Advanced Trainee will be required to rotate between more than one hospital or department to complete part of their training.
- It is expected that the appointee will undertake a research project.
- The candidate will be required to assist in the provision of an afterhours roster.

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible to apply for an advanced training position, candidates must either be a current advanced trainee in Cardiology or a new applicant:

New advanced trainee applicants must be:


- In the process of completing the FRACP clinical examination (both written and practical) and have an interest in Cardiology or
- Successfully completed the FRACP clinical examination and
- Registered with the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA).

HOW TO APPLY

Applicants must submit an application through the <u>Queensland Health RMO Campaign</u> by the closing date of the campaign **Monday, 30 June 2025**.
