

Queensland Internal Medicine Education Program

Overview

The **Queensland Internal Medicine Education Program (QIMEP)** is a registrar-led education initiative for advanced trainees in general medicine.

The series of lectures runs fortnightly on Wednesday evenings from 5 - 6 pm from February to December and is available statewide through Microsoft Teams.

The topics focus on practical and clinically relevant issues which affect the daily practice of medical registrars and cover areas of rapid change, core general medical problems, research skills, interpersonal and professional skills, as well as areas that trainees may have limited exposure to throughout their training.

The participants are mainly advanced trainees in general medicine who are located in metropolitan and regional hospitals across Queensland. Some general physicians and basic physician trainees also attend for their own professional development.

As part of the program, the QIMEP committee organise networking dinners and education days for general medicine advanced trainees.
