What length of contract does your facility offer?

Interns are provided with a 2 year contract to support rotation planning and career progression, and provide security.

ROTATIONS

Will there be opportunities to do term rotations at another facility? If yes, which facility/facilities will the rotation(s) be to?

Yes, the Emergency and Medicine Departments function as the one Department/Health Service across both Hervey Bay and Maryborough Hospital. During your Medicine and ED rotations, you may have shifts in Maryborough Hospital. This provides for a diverse and rich learning experience.

RURAL PLACEMENT

Is rural placement part of PGY1?

Rural Rotations have been established for PGY2 to maximise clinical activity and learning opportunities.

REMOTE CALL

Does your facility require remote call? If yes, what are the conditions?

Ward call is rostered in PGY2 for Medicine and Surgical Rotations. There is no ward call for Interns.

OVERTIME

What is the average workload per week for each term? Is overtime required? If yes, will this be paid?

38 hours per week.

There may be the opportunity for rostered overtime in some departments (if unrostered overtime is required for clinical purposes it will be paid).

NIGHT DUTY

Does your facility require night duty? If yes, what are the conditions?

Interns have access to maximal support on day, evening and weekend shifts, but will not work nights.

Night shift is reserved for experienced PGY2+ Medical Officers.

LEAVE

Am I able to take leave any time during the year or will I have to be part of a leave roster?

PGY1 Leave is as per line allocation preferencing process. Discuss special circumstances with the Medical Education Officers.

PGY2 Leave is negotiated with the DCT and the Clinical Director of the Department.

LEAVE IN ADVANCE

Do I need to negotiate my leave in advance? Who do I need to negotiate leave with and when do I need to do this by?

As above, Intern's have a 5 week block that is allocated as per line preferencing process.

For PGY2+ you will need to submit your preference for leave to <u>WBHHS-JuniorMedicalRecruitment@health.qld.gov.au</u> at least 6 weeks prior to the proposed dates. The more notice you give, the better your chances of getting your desired leave dates.

RELOCATION

Does your facility provide financial assistance with relocation?

Yes, up to \$5,000 contribution towards relocation expenses (receipts required for reimbursement).

ACCOMMODATION

4 weeks accommodation in a hospital provided house/unit or up to \$1,000 rent subsidy for the first four weeks.
